

# Welcome

We are delighted that you have declared your horse to run at Aintree and we look forward to welcoming you.

### Pre- Arrival

Please register your attendance through the PASS system <a href="https://www.rcapass.com/concierge/login.xhtml">https://www.rcapass.com/concierge/login.xhtml</a> submitting the names of all the individual(s) who will attend the race meeting, by 3pm the day before racing. Please ensure you submit your name as one of the attendee's and do not submit multiple guest attendees under the same name. All guest names must be inputted, to save any issues on the day.

If you do not have access to the PASS System or need any assistance in its use, please contact the PASS Helpdesk on 01933 270333 or pass@weatherbys.co.uk. The PASS system is only applicable to all UK trained horses and the PASS card is issued to the first named owner.

Badges are not permitted to be transferred. Children under the age of 18 do not require a badge.

We encourage syndicate managers & trainers to share this Owners information brochure with their members, to ensure that they are also aware of the information provided. Syndicate managers or trainers will have authorisation to input attendees' details in the PASS system.

Single ownership - Eight badges & six meal vouchers.

Partnerships & Syndicates - Eight badges & eight meal vouchers.

Subject to availability additional badges can be purchased on the day at the half price rate of £15, as well as meal vouchers at £25 per person.

Large Syndicates - We understand that ownership comes in many different forms and as such we offer syndicates and racing clubs to be able to swap their complimentary lunches for up to 20 admission tickets to the racecourse. Meal vouchers can be purchased by syndicate members if they wish. This needs to be clearly communicated to syndicate members before arrival. Our syndicate Lounge, the Red Rum Bar located on the ground floor of the Earl of Derby Grandstand will be available to all owners including syndicates throughout the day.

Aintree Racecourse is located on the A59, just one mile from the M57 and M58, which link the M62 and M6. Follow the A59 to Liverpool and the yellow/tourism signs as you approach the racecourse for routes to the car parks.

# OWNERS' & TRAINERS' CAR PARK

PLEASE NOTE - There is now a different car park for Owners & Trainers for. Access to this Car Park is via the Seeds Lane & Melling Road entrance, the same as the horseboxes. Postcode detailed above. To access this car park, please show your digital car pass either on a print out or on your phone when you arrive. Our parking marshals will guide you on where to park. There are car parking spaces available for disabled visitors in the Owners and Trainers Car Park. Please ensure you bring your blue badge with you and the parking stewards will guide you on the day.

#### **TAXIS**

If you plan to travel by taxi, you can be dropped off by the main entrance and there will be an Owners and Trainers ticket collection point there. If you require a taxi after racing, we recommend SRC Taxis on 0151 928 3535 who will be able to pick you up from the main entrance or the O and T car park.

### **TRAIN**

Merseyrail trains run between Liverpool Central and Aintree Station every 15 minutes. Aintree station is across the road from the racecourse, a less than 5 minute walk. For those arriving by train at Aintree Station, there is an Owners and Trainers ticket collection point at the main entrance to the Racecourse.

### **HELICOPTER**

An area on the racecourse is provided for helicopter landing.

Prior notice is required in advance for landing facilities and insurance indemnity. Please email Carly Sage Aintree.owners@thejockeyclub.co.uk. Particular attention is to be paid to the rules of the air which govern the overflying of built up areas. No landings will be permitted 30 minutes before the first race and no take-offs will be permitted until 30 minutes after the last race.

If you are arriving by helicopter, please notify Carly Sage in advance, so that your badges are available upon landing.

# On the day



### **GATES OPEN AT 10.35AM**

Gates will open 2 hours before the first horse race.

The first horse race will take place at 12:35pm. We will also have Shetland pony racing and pony racing finals taking place from 11.10am

Once parked, please make your way to our Owners Entrance, which is by the entrance to the Alan Lee Media Centre, opposite the Lord Sefton Grandstand. Please ensure you use the Horsebox and Owners and trainer's car park off Seeds Lane/ Melling Road and NOT by the Equestrian Centre. There will be stewards to guide you.

Please present your PASS card or some form of ID to collect your badges.

There will be free tea/coffee on arrival & also access to the toilets (including accessible) in the Owners and Trainers entrance.

Please note that the Owners & Trainers badge collection desk will close after the 4<sup>th</sup> race. If you feel you will be later than this, please let Carly Sage on 0151 522 2959 know and she will be happy to assist.

### **ACCESSABILITY**

With the introduction of the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) in October 2005, Aintree Racecourse, in common with all premises offering access to the Public in England and Wales, assumed a mandatory obligation to provide easy access to all parts of its premises for people with Disabilities, wherever reasonably practicable. The Act recognizes, however, that full access is not always reasonably achievable in older existing buildings, and therefore states that in these cases people with disabilities should be able to gain easy access into the premises and that the services they require should be made available to them in close proximity to their entry point.

Aintree Racecourse comprises an interlinked grouping of multi-storey buildings on one site, some updated as recently as 2008 and with significant changes in floor levels both between and within individual buildings.

# Hospitality



Owners and Trainers will be able to enjoy a two course carvery dinner in the Golden Miller Suite, situated on the 1st floor of the Earl of Derby Grandstand, close to the Parade Ring.

Within this facility you will be able to choose from a complimentary carvery buffet, available up until the fourth race. Tables will be allocated as you arrive, and we kindly ask that you vacate your table once you have eaten so that we can accommodate everyone. Please note, tables may be shared with the Owners of another horse. If you have any dietary requirements, please inform the catering assistants. There will be vegan, vegetarian & gluten free options as well as a children's menu.

We continue to operate on a 'cashless' basis. However, cash may be used when placing bets on-course.

Large syndicates will be given the opportunity to forfeit their meal vouchers for additional badges and will be permitted to use the syndicate lounge in the Red Rum Bar located on the ground floor of the Earl of Derby Grandstand. This bar is available for all Owners to use throughout the day.

### **VIEWING THE RACING**

Owners' and Trainers' viewing areas are on the steppings of the Lord Sefton Grandstand and the balcony of the Golden Miller Suite in the Earl of Derby Grandstand. The Golden Miller suite balcony is wheelchair accessible.

### PARADE RING AND WINNER'S ENCLOSURE

Owners will have access to the Parade Ring for the race in which they have a runner, in line with capacity calculation limits. Depending on the amount of runners in a particular race, on busier race days we may need to limit the number of owners and guests who can enter the parade ring for each runner.

The connections of the first four in each race are welcomed into the Winners Enclosure after the race.
