The Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards are British racing's annual tribute to the remarkable people who provide our horses with exceptional levels of care and attention. For the first time in 2021, all those who make the shortlist of ten for each category but don't make the final 3 will receive £250 in recognition of their achievement.

David Nicholson Newcomer Award

Leadership Award

£5,000 to the winner, and £5,000 is match funded to the winner's yard. £2,000 is also awarded to both runners-up, as well as £2,000 to their yard.

Stud Staff Award

£5,000 to the winner, which is match funded with £5,000 to the winner's stud. £2,000 is also awarded to both runners-up, as well as £2,000 to their stud.

Dedication Award

£5,000 to the winner, which is match funded with £5,000 to the winner's yard/stud. £2,000 is also awarded to both runners-up, as well as £2,000 to their yard/stud.

Community Award

(in recognition of Rory MacDonald)
£5,000 to the winner, which is match funded with £5,000 to the charity of their choice. £2,000 is also awarded to both runners-up, as well as £2,000 awarded to the charities of their choice.

The Employee of the Year Award

£10,000 to the winner, with the same amount going to their yard/stud.

The winners of the Leadership, Rider/Groom, Stud, Dedication categories are eligible to win this category.



Nick Luck
(Chair)

Nick is a broadcaster and writer who has been an integral part of network television presentation of the sport's biggest events around the world for 15 years. Formerly the frontman for Channel 4 Racing, he is currently a host/reporter for NBC Sports, encompassing the Triple Crown, Breeders' Cup and Royal Ascot, as well as Racing TV, for whom his widely acclaimed talk show, Luck on Sunday, is now in its fourth season. He has been voted HWP Racing Broadcaster of the Year eight times.



George McGrath

George was apprentice to Ian Balding and rode several winners before becoming travelling groom for Willie Musson for 12 years. Having served as President of the National Association of Racing Staff, George was elected Chief Executive in August 2012.



Mick Fitzgerald

Mick's glittering riding career spanned twenty years and featured a long spell as stable jockey to Nicky Henderson as well as big-race success on Rough Quest in The Grand National and See More Business in the Cheltenham Gold Cup & King George. Following retirement in 2008 Mick has been a successful broadcaster for Attheraces, Channel 4, Sky Sports Racing and ITV.



Hazel Peplinski

Born into breeding, hunting and point-to-point racing, Hazel rode a handful of winners as an amateur jockey. Since then she has been Clerk of the Course at Hamilton Park, Ayr and Kelso. Before being appointed Chief Executive of Perth Racecourse she was Chief Executive and a Director of Hamilton Park.



James Frank

James was crowned Employee of the Year in 2020. James came to Britain from Zimbabwe in his mid-twenties and has worked in the racing and breeding industry for seventeen years. Most recently at Hascombe and Valiant Stud, his unswerving commitment to the mares and their foals and his skill with highly strung animals has seen him involved in the early stages of some of the modern greats of Flat racing, including Golden Horn and Cracksman.



Dinah Nicholson

Wife of the late David Nicholson, after whom the Newcomer award is named, Dinah has been a key figurehead within the industry for many years, playing a vital role in the Godolphin Stud and Stable Staff Awards since inception whilst continuing her involvement in the industry.



Eileen Harte

Eileen started her career in the thoroughbred breeding industry working for Kerr & Co. Bloodstock Agents, going on to various other roles in the industry including PA to the MD of Weatherby's Ireland and Stud Secretary at Moyglare Stud. When she and her husband moved to the UK 15 years ago, they set up the successful boarding and consigning business Keith Harte Bloodstock Ltd. Eileen is passionate about the industry and those who work within it, acting as a mentor with Women in Racing.



Ollie McPhail

Starting as part of the stable staff team with legendary trainer David Nicholson 22 years ago, Ollie progressed through the amateur jockey ranks before riding as a professional for 10 years. A past winner of the JETS Richard Davis award, Ollie now works for the charity Racing to School as Lead Education Officer.



Sally Aston

Sally has spent a lifetime involved within the thoroughbred industry, from riding as a jockey to overseeing preparation of youngsters from her own Goldford Stud, and managing numerous high profile broodmares and followers for long standing clients. Her dedication to the thoroughbred is matched by her pride in judging these awards.



Dawn Goodfellow

Dawn joined Racing Welfare as Chief Executive in August 2015 from the Northern Racing College, where she had been since the beginning of 2008. In both her roles, Dawn has had the privilege of working closely with stable staff and their development and welfare are her driving passion.



Captain Guy Disney MBE

Guy is a former soldier and a jump jockey and in March 2017 became the first jockey to ride a winner under rules in Britain with a prosthetic leg. He then successfully rode Gallery Exhibition over the Grand National fences at Aintree in April 2018 in the Foxhunters Chase. In 2011 Guy trekked to the North Pole, together with a team of wounded servicemen, for the charity Walking for the Wounded. Guy is also involved with charitable work and is a member of the Diversity in Racing Steering Group.



Mark Bradburne

Mark rode as a jump jockey for 10 years from 2001-2011, having previously been an amateur. He broke his back in a fall in 2009 and now runs his own business as an electrician in Lambourn. Mark is also one of a team of former jockeys who now act as BHA Jockey Coaches for conditional and apprentice jockeys.

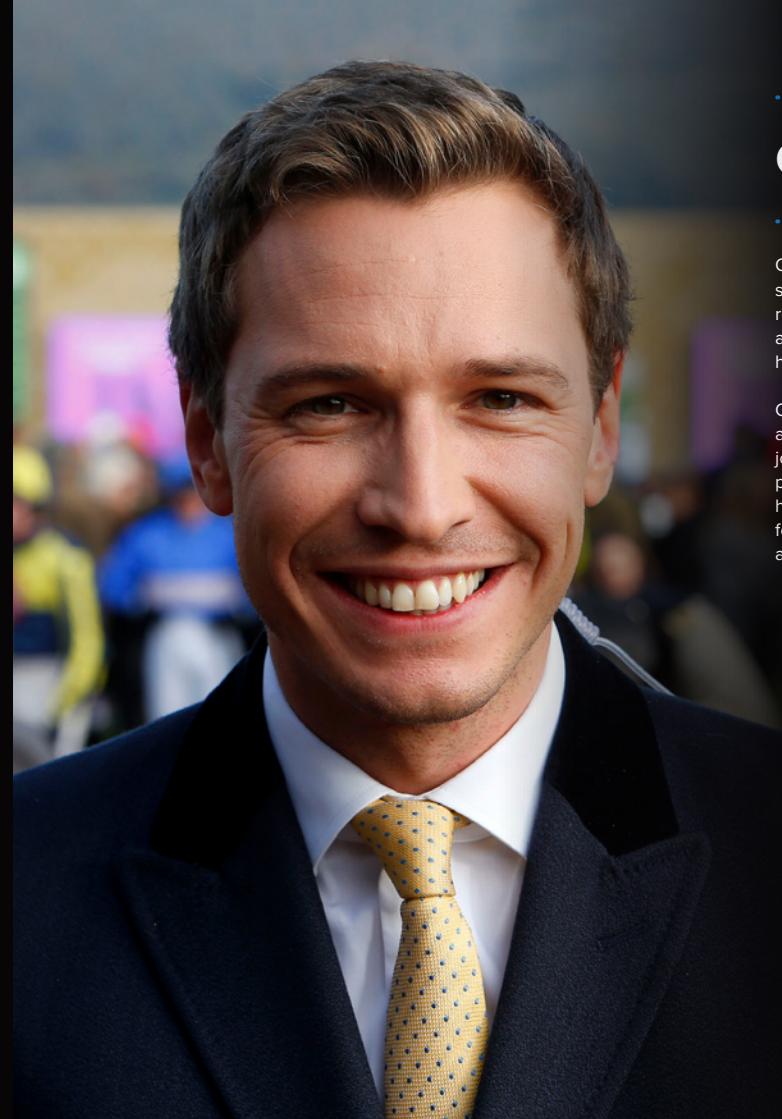


Ed Chamberlin

Ed Chamberlin is the BAFTA award winning main presenter on ITV Racing. ITV took over from Channel 4, after an absence of more than 30 years, as the home of British racing television coverage on January 1st 2017. Since then Ed has fronted all the big races and Festivals in the UK, including the Cheltenham Festival, 1,000 and 2,000 Guineas, The Oaks and Derby, Glorious Goodwood, St Leger, Champions Day, Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and in April he became just the 8th broadcaster to present the Grand National on terrestrial television.

Ed started his working life on the 1996 BHB Graduate Scheme, which led to a job as an odds compiler at Ladbrokes. From there he moved to become editor of Sports Adviser Magazine. After weekly appearances on Bloomberg Television, Sky Sports came calling and after stints appearing on '90 Minutes' and 'The Full SP' in 2003 Ed took a full-time position as a presenter on Sky Sports News.

In 2010 Ed became the face of the Premier League on Sky Sports, presenting their flagship shows Super Sunday and Monday Night Football, alongside Gary Neville and Jamie Carragher. Then in 2016 came the call from ITV and a dream switch back to horseracing.



Oli Bell

Oli's passion for broadcasting began with a stint on his local school's radio station, and reporting on horses didn't come far behind as a live radio reporter at the Burghley Horse Trials. Soon reporting from events such as Land Rover G4 Challenge and the British Touring Car Championships, having left school Oli quickly became a presenter on Racing TV.

Oli has broadcasted from events including Royal Ascot, the Grand National and the Cheltenham Festival as well as a spell on Sky in Australia. He joined the BAFTA winning ITV Racing Team in 2017, also going on to present football, boxing and darts on ITV. Away from broadcasting, Oli has played on the professional poker circuit and played both cricket and football to a high standard in South Africa and Australia. Oli also became a patron of the Ebony Horse Club charity in Brixton, South London in 2018.

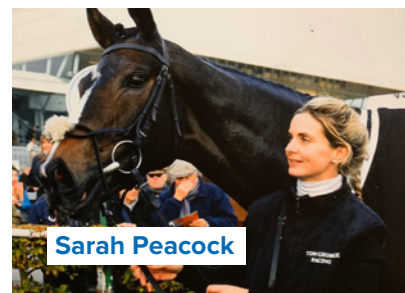
